The theme of this year's Teen Tech Camp is "Animatronics: Bringing Projects to Life"! This camp is run by OVMoD board member Dr Mark Lucas and staffed by local coding and computer engineering experts. Participants will learn to use the Arduino microcontroller to add motion and interaction to projects.

Our Site

The Ohio Valley Museum of Discovery was founded in 2006 with a mission to inspire confidence in people of all ages to explore and discover the world. In early 2024, the doors opened on our

Health and Safety Plan

Medical

The Camp Director or Senior Staff will hold all medication. **Campers are not allowed to be in possession of prescription or non-prescription medication, with the exception of those able to self-administer inhalers or epi-pens.** Prescription medication, including inhalers and epi-pens, must be clearly labeled in its original container. All prescription medication must be accompanied by a statement signed and dated by the doctor explaining exact dosage, directions, and time to be administered, and, in the case of inhalers or epi-pens, permission to self-carry.

Over the counter medication may be dispensed with signed permission and dosages from the caregiver or guardian.

Camp staff will treat minor injuries such as small cuts, bumps, and insect bites or stings and will report injuries to caregivers at camp pick up. If the injury needs further treatment, the Camp Director will contact the caregiver, guardian, or emergency contact.

Health and Safety Protocols

In accordance with 2024 guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, OVMoD strives to avoid transmission of contagious illnesses, especially respiratory illnesses.

Museum staff regularly clean and sanitize high-touch surfaces. This includes wiping door handles, light switches, tables, and other high-touch surfaces. Museum staff, volunteers, and camp participants wash hands and/or use hand sanitizer frequently while working on-site. Any camper is welcome to wear a mask if desired.

If a camp participant reports they do not feel well or shows signs of any symptoms of contagious illness, the participant should be kept home from camp. If any signs or symptoms present while camp is in session, the participant will be separated from others and the caregiver will be contacted.

Examples of symptoms include: fever or chills, cough, nasal congestion or runny nose, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, diarrhea, nausea or vomiting, tiredness, headache, muscle or body aches, poor appetite.



Accessibility

OVMoD has worked with the Athens County Board of Developmental Disabilities to ensure that the museum is welcoming and accessible to all. Handicapped parking is available onsite, and the accessible entrance is located at the rear of the building, where a lift can transport visitors to both floors of the museum.
